Do I need a power adapter for Pyongyang?

Pyongyang uses power outlets and plugs of type C. Take a look at the picture below to see what this plug and power socket looks like: Doesn't look familiar?

Do the outlets look different in your country?

You'll need a power plug. Korea primarily uses a 220-volt electrical system, slightly lower than the 240 volts used in some regions. However, most buildings also include 110-volt outlets, accommodating both local residents and international visitors. This dual-voltage setup ensures compatibility for a variety of devices and. Asiana Airlines has certain items that are restricted or strictly prohibited in the cabin for safety reasons. Please make sure to read through the following information before your flight. If the standard voltage in your country is between 220 and 240 volts, like in the UK, Europe, Australia, and most of Asia and Africa, then you can use your electric appliances in Korea. If the standard. The Korean Ministry of Land, Infrastructure and Transport (MOLIT) has announced stricter rules regarding power banks (portable lithium-ion batteries) on airplanes. Note that type C and F are interchangeable.

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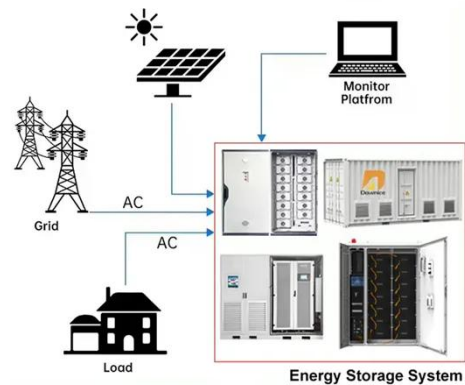
